She hosted three exceptional NAARVA National Camp Rallies, including the 25th Silver Anniversary in 2017. As the newly elected NAARVA National President in July 2017—she designated the theme for her term as:

"One Team, One Voice, One NAARVA."

"It is hoped that this theme will guide us in the decisions that we make on behalf of the organization in our quest to establish a firm foundation for NAARVA to begin the next twentyfive plus years." - Carolyn Buford.

My husband, Clarence, shared his Famous Chicken Pot Pie Recipe with me.

Ingredients:

Pie Pastry Shells (2) 1 Can Chicken Broth Frozen Peas & Carrots (1 medium pkg.)

Cream of Chicken Soup (1) Cream of Mushroom Soup (1) Poultry Seasonings (season to taste)

1 T. Flour (as a thickening)

1 C. Chopped Chicken Breast (grilled)

1/2 C. Potatoes (cubed and boiled) 1/2 C. Celery (chopped)

Salt & Black Pepper (season to taste)

Boil potatoes in a small pot until almost done. Combine in a large pot the chicken broth, potatoes, celery, cream of mushroom soup, cream of chicken soup and frozen peas and carrots plus flour (for thickness). Cook ingredients until almost soft stirring constantly so it won't stick to the pot.

Season the mixture to taste with the poultry seasoning, salt and black pepper. Pour cooked ingredients into a pie pastry shell. Add the second pie pastry shell on top and pinch around the edges so ingredients won't leak out. Gently cut an 'X' on top of the second pie pastry shell.

Preheat convention oven 350 degrees. Bake until pie shell is golden brown. Yum, enjoy!



Support Local Farmers' Markets

By late summer the lakes and pool warm up with the lazy, humid days of summer. The farmers' markets also heat up — with ripe, seasonal produce, and fruit and vegetable stands heaped with impressive selections. As my husband and I RV across the country, we often seek out local farmers' markets and road stands for the freshest produce for smoothies, juicing and eating. Here are some reasons to shop market-style for the remainder of the summer and into early fall:

Fresh and Local

Produce grown locally means it's picked at peak ripeness and it travels very little distance to customers — not sitting for weeks or months or traveling thousands of miles before it's sold.

Picked at Peak Season

Most grocery store produce are picked before they're ripe, to extend shelf life. However, picking early often compromises taste. Alternately, the produce you'll find at a local farmers' market is grown seasonally and harvested at its freshest point.



Peak Nutrition

Akin to taste, the most potent nutritional value is also compromised when fruits and veggies are harvested before they're ripe.

Support Your Local Economy

When you're home, choosing to shop at a farmers' market supports farmers and your local community by keeping consumer money directly in your area — funneled from you directly to the farmer.

Food Affordability

Organic foods are typically a lot more affordable straight from the farmer than from a specialty "organic" store or at your large grocery retailer.

Variety is the Spice of Farmers Markets

At the market, the variety of fruits and veggies is overwhelming. Plus, I have the option to try kale from several farmers and pick my very favorite variety (as they all grow differently).

Passive Steering on Motorhome Tag Axles

Many larger diesel pushers made today are equipped with tag axles. This is a third axle having single wheels at each side that resides behind the dual wheeled drive axle. This feature increases the carrying capacity to help meet the heavier optioned coaches. They also can reduce the weight distributed on the drive axle such that lower air pressure can be used in the rear tire sets. This often contributes to a smoother, softer vehicle ride.



Tag Axle Wear

One of the issues with the additional axle is that it can reduce the turning radius slightly. This is caused by somewhat simulating a longer wheelbase by moving the pivot point further back.

Additionally, abnormal tread wear can result on the tag's tires as they are forced to skid during a tight turning maneuver. To overcome both of these issues, the RV chassis makers designed a driver-controlled pneumatic suspension solution. The axle's air bag could be unloaded so the only weight during the turn would be that of the axle, or, aired fully up, lifting the axle tires from the ground. The method depended on the manufacturer, but ei-

ther worked well.

Passive Solution

Commercial vehicles like Prevost and MCI passenger buses adapted another solution and have used it for years. They used a steerable tag axle. The most common being a passive steer type. Basically, the wheels steer in the needed direction controlled by the vehicle's turning angle configuration

In 2014 or so, RV makers and their chassis suppliers started offering passive steering tag axles. Perhaps they introduced it to one-up their competition. In my opinion, the air up or unload was all that was needed in the RV application.

So, why is this feature needed in the

commercial bus industry, but perhaps not beneficial in the RV application? Tour buses are engaged constantly in turning within a tight radius many times each day with the likes of hotel parking lots, etc. Motorhomes are not constantly challenged with this requirement and can turn as tight as a passive steer axle using the air-up feature. A steerable tag transfers the rear pivot point to the center of the drive axle. An aired up or unloaded tag also transfers the pivot to the drive axle center. There is no tighter a radius turn with either. Any statement otherwise is just smoke and mirrors.

But, like many new features being offered today, there are buyers that insist on such technology and those who do not. However, in most cases steerable tag axles either come with a unit or don't — it's another item to add to your list of considerations when shopping for a new RV.


Seminars were fun and educational. Highlights included:


