Hi, NAARVA Family!



We Have A Heart Problem

What is it about our heart that God warns us about? What is so special about our hearts? Why is our heart one of the most essential organs not only in our physical body, but in ourspiritual body?

The heart is a significant part of man's spiritual makeup. It is the place that holds our emotions and desires; it is that which drives the will of man towards action.

The heart of man is a spiritual connection between man and God. When the Holy Spirit inflames our hearts, **Matthew 3:11,** it gives us faith, truth, and knowledge. Through our hearts, God, the Holy Spirit, speaks to us. When we offer God our hearts, we rely more on Him and trust His Word. **Romans 10:10,** "For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confessions is made unto salvation."

The heart is the starting place for spiritual obedience. **Genesis 4:7**, "If

thou doest well, shalt thou not be accepted? And if thou doest not well, sin lieth at the door. And unto thee shall be his desire, and thou shalt rule over him. Cain had a heart of stone, refusing to be obedient to God, refusing to serve God with a loving heart. He desired to serve his own selfish, evil, sinful ways.

God told Cain to adjust his understanding, attitude, intellect, and behavior of what Cain thought was good for him to understand what God knew was good for Cain's benefit and God's Kingdom. If Cain were to do well by God's standard, God would accept him. In other words, there is no reason for Cain to be angry about God's rejection of his offering. The cure for God's rejection is obedience with a loving heart: if Cain were to do right, according to the will of God, God would be pleased and accept his offering. But Cain had no desire in his heart to obey God's will, he had a stony heart.





Ezekiel 36:26, "A new heart also will I give you, and a new spirit will I put within you: and I will take away the stony heart out of your flesh, and I will give you a heart of flesh."


Israel's heart had become rebellious, idolatrous, and hardened against God. Israel had broken their covenant with God, but the Lord, in His grace, promised to make a New Covenant with His people. In the New Covenant with Israel, the Lord promised to give His people a new heart of flesh to replace a heart of stone. God promised to give them a new spirit of grace through the power of the indwelling Holy Spirit of life and love.

Their hearts were infected with selfishness; they were flooded with degenerate desires. The entire population was filled with pride and boastfulness. All humanity had a propensity towards arrogance, disobedience, ungratefulness, and godlessness. Every person, Jew and Gentile alike, was born dead in their sin and at enmity with God.

God promised to purify their heart and cleanse their inner soul through the blood of a sinless Mediator, Christ. "I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit within you," was God's promise to His people, "and I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh." Despite centuries of rebellion, God promised to remove men's rock-hard heart of stone and replace it with a heart that is sensitive to the Lord and responsive to His Word.

We would like to believe that people, in their hearts, are essentially good that

they must be coerced, victimized, or provoked into having bad behavior. However, Jesus said the opposite: that sins, evil thoughts, sexual immorality, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, lewdness, envy, slander, arrogance, and foolishness originate in the heart of man, Mark 7:21-23.

Yes, humanity has a heart problem, and it is in desperate need of a heart transplant. If we look at what is going on in the world today: fighting in Israel, fighting in Ukraine, and fighting between two major political parties in the United States of America, we can conclude that man's desire is selfish. If man truly desires to please God, God's love would propagate and perpetual in their hearts. **Mark 7:6-7**, "They, too, had hearts far from God." The Pharisees pretended to care about God's law by following outward acts like hand washing, but they did not care about God on the inside. When they met God in the person of Jesus, they tried to kill Him! Jesus summarized their heart condition: "You have let go of the commands of God and are holding on to human traditions," **Mark 7:8.** The Pharisees still did religious things but had forgotten the reasons behind their actions. They said the right things, but their hearts were far from God.

We attend church on Sundays, and refuse to pick up our Bibles during the week. When Sunday comes around again, we forget where we placed our Bibles. We ask our spouse, "Honey, have you seen my Bible?" Our spouse replies, "Remember honey, when you came home from church last week, you placed your Bible on the nightstand next to your side of the bed." We maintain the outward appearance of religious obedience by following basic rules, yet we lack any real relationship with God in our hearts. Oh yes, we faithfully attend church every Sunday; some of us have a position in the church, but we ignore God's Word the rest of the week. We must stop "faking and shaking." It is not spiritual. There is an old worldly saying that says follow the money. People spend their money on what they need and what they desire. Look at your checkbook/banking account; it will tell you what your heart desires.

God is not pleased with those of us who only enforce rules and rituals. Isaiah 29:13, "Wherefore the Lord said, Forasmuch as this people draw near me with their mouth, and with their lips do honour me, but have removed their heart far from me, and the precept of men teaches their fear toward me." The prophet Isaiah reveals a disturbing truth about the people of God in his day. They were religious people who were good at going through the motions of worship. They said all of the right things. However, their words were inconsistent with the actual condition of their hearts.

To the casual observers, those who lack spiritual discernment, it can appear they are devout Christians, but the reality is, in their hearts, they are far from God. God wants true righteousness. God wants us to love Him with "all our heart and with all our soul and with all our mind and with all our strength." Mark 12:30.

Cain did not love God the way God wanted Cain to love Him. God wanted Cain to give his offering with a desiring heart. "For I desire mercy, not sacrifice, and acknowledgment of God rather than burnt offerings," Hosea 6:6.

Praise God, Praise God! Amen



NAARVA ECOLOGY PROGRAM

"Loving Our Earth - Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, Respect"

In this issue of the *VOICE*, the NEP continues our focus on the threatening swelling of environmental plastic pollution as it proceeds across our globe seemingly unconstrained, and at best inadequately addressed by regulatory authoritative controls. Plastics contribute to the degradation of all ecosystems, land, and marine as well as freshwater. It is a major driver of biodiversity loss and contributes to unfavorable climate change.

We know that plastic waste can take anywhere from 100 to 1000 years (US EPA.goy Plastics Mar. '25) to decompose, and even then, it never fully disappears but instead breaks apart into smaller and smaller pieces. These small pieces are categorized as either microplastics, or (even smaller) nanoplastics, and are now found in every ecosystem on the planet from the Antarctic tundra to tropical coral reefs. Both have been shown to gain entry into living bodies... human and so many other lifeforms such as plants, birds, wildlife, marine life, insects, microbes, and so on. They are detected in heart, lung, placental, breast milk, liver, kidney, and brain tissue. The fact that these accumulated plastics can become bioactive elements within living organisms as they are small enough to interfere with or alter normal bodily mechanisms is unnerving, and should be. The extent of damages from ensuing buildup of plastics in human cells is not yet fully defined, but it is clear that bio accumulated plastics can cause cell damage, alter cell function, and in due course disturb the normal activity of bodily systems. Studies have listed associations between microplastics and cardiovascular disease, along with low male fertility. Chemicals found in microplastics or nanoplastics are known to cause cancers, various metabolic disorders, and disturbances in mental acuity. (AAMC.org AAMC News June '24)

It is indeed unfortunate that the benefits of plastics, which include their buoyancy, durability, application and economic advantages, are powerless to balance their downside of harmful environmental unsustainability. Other materials such as wood, metal, or paper products lack the advantages of plastics employed in activities such as packaging, medical applications, as well as household, recreational, and boundless other utilities.

Hope for remedy of our global plastic conundrum appears to lie primarily in the regulatory control of production, disposition, and recycling of ALL plastic materials. The NAARVA membership, and all of its sphere of influence must center in on previously recommended courses of action. After all, how else can we best contribute to the continuance of a healthy environment for our children, grandchildren, descendants, and posterity to enjoy a wholesome and vigorous RV life? Surely, we want clear skies, green valleys and blue waters open to them as they are to us. **Review again the suggested ecofriendly camping actions below.** Commit to them. Commit


to lobbying for adequate regulatory control through your local governances and those who hold authoritative posts. Join in with local environmental organizations of your choice. Some may request, and accept with much appreciation, donations of whatever amount you choose to give. Some states such as New York, California and others have banned plastic bag use already. Single (and very brief) use of plastic bags has become quite a menace to environmental preservation.

Eco-friendly camping actions:

- (1) Travel as light as possible.
- (2) Use reusable, refillable drinking containers (such as stainless steel).
- (3) Use reusable dishware and utensils; don't accept plastic utensils when purchasing foods.
 - (4) Use only reusable shopping bags.
- (5) Lessen waste; buy less, when possible, dispose responsibly, and compost when possible.
- (6) Carry in/carry out (do not leave anything at your campsite that wasn't there before).
 - (7) Use biodegradable products.

Most importantly, we resolve to defend the eradication of unchecked production, inadequate replacement, unregulated disposal, and ineffective recycling of (used) plastics. We need to create workable CIRCULAR PLASTIC ECONO-MIES so that plastic items... particularly those used for only mere minutes (bags, cups, straws, tableware) do not continue damaging our environment and ecosystems for hundreds of years.

An economy in which production of new plastic is hugely reduced, and used plastic is properly recycled to serve as necessary resource plastic, and does not become waste relegated to landfills only to be incinerated, contributing to greenhouse gas production, is primary.

As such, we are encouraged to collectively support existing and proven efforts to protect the health and continuance of our home, Mother Earth.

So... LAST, but not least let's not forget the upcoming **April 22nd EARTH DAY**... the annual event held every April 22 since 1970. This day has become the anniversary of a global environmental movement, celebrated through mobilization of more than a billion people to enlist in a variety of nature preservation and eco-friendly inspired activities. Ventures include support of forestry or other vegetation, recycling of resources such as plastics, joining community clean-ups, and much more.



"Loving Our Earth"

EARTH DAY offers historic opportunity for clubs to donate time, effort, and currency toward national and international woodland conservation or reforestation efforts. Local area forestry support is crucially needed as well. Organizations that perform extensive tree planting activities can customarily assure tree planting activities at a cost as meager as \$1.00 per tree. We recall that trees help clean the air that we breathe, filter the water that we drink, provide habitat to 80% of land-dwelling creatures, and absorb harmful carbon dioxide from our atmosphere among other benefits.

Our own *Texas Sojourners* have made a \$50 donation to EARTH DAY 2025, slated to support the various EARTH DAY activities. Additionally, the Sojourners have planted 136 trees worldwide, through the internationally recognized ONE TREE PLANTED... a non-profit organization focused on global reforestation. Of equal importance is the NAARVA Ecology Committee, prologue to the development of what is now the NAARVA ECOLOGY PROGRAM (NEP), which during multiple past national rallies have *planted an "area-indigenous" tree at the Rally site*, this along with a fixed NAARVA dedication plaque representing our organization's commitment to preservation. *NAARVA*, through the NEP, has also planted a total of 100 trees in the Amazon Rain forest via the One Tree Planted non-profit.
