NAARVA Chaplain's Corner...

God Sees You!

My brothers and sisters in Christ, I do not know what trials and tribulations you are going through. Maybe you are dealing with circumstances that are so heavy that it's breaking you into pieces, or maybe it's unfavorable health diagnoses from your doctor, or maybe it's a broken relationship with your spouse that feels as though your marriage is beyond repair, or maybe your kids are disobedient, or maybe it's a deep constant mental stress of not knowing how you are going to make it from day to day.

No matter what you are going through, I have some good news from God: *He sees you!* He sees your struggles, He knows the weight you are carrying, He understands your tears, even when you think no one is around to see you cry, *He sees you*. Let me remind you of something that will help ease your mind and promote better sleep. God loves you, and He still works miracles.

Have you been stuck in a distressful situation for so long that you start

to believe things will not change? You told yourself this is how life is supposed to be. God has a message for you, His Word, Isaiah 41:10, NIV, "So do not fear, for I am with you: do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you, and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."

God spoke these words to the Israelites, who were ripped from their homes and driven hundreds of miles away to live under oppression in a foreign land. The Babylonians destroyed the Israelites' cities and burned down their temple, causing the Israelites to wonder: Does God not care about us anymore? Has he completely abandoned us? Lamentations 5:20-23.

After suffering in enemy territory for decades, it feels like God has forgotten His people, **Isaiah 40:27**, **49:14.** So God reassures them, and he addresses the terror they felt un-

der their foreign overlords, declaring: "Do not fear, I will help you." God strengthens His point and repeats this reassurance three separate times.


But what will Israel's help look like? God's "right hand," a symbol of His power, will make things right for Israel by executing justice against the Babylonians for their brutality. God will raise a new power that will take the world by storm and make Israel's Babylonian enemies as nothing, Isaiah 41:2-3, 41:11-12.

Isaiah 44:28 and 45:1 - Identify this new power as Cyrus, King of Persia, who is prophesied to be God's instrument for rebuilding Jerusalem and the Temple. God declares Cyrus to be my shepherd and states that he will perform all my pleasure concerning the rebuilding of Jerusalem. This verse is significant because it names Cyrus long before he was born, demonstrating God's foreknowledge and sovereignty.

Though it looks like their foreign overlords hold all the power, the Israelite captives can trust that this current suffering is temporary. To support this case, the passage appeals to Israel's relationship with God thus far and invites reflection on key moments, such as their exodus from Egypt. These moments provide insight into how God's help aligns with His past acts of redemption.

Babylonians could not stand before the God who had defeated Pharaoh

of Egypt and his vast armies. Just as God redeemed his people from slavery by reclaiming them from Pharaoh's wrongful possession, **Exodus 6:6**, now he will again act as their redeemer, wrestling them out of Babylon's wrongful grasp, **Isaiah 41:13-14.**

As He did before, God will help His people toward freedom again, leading them in a new exodus, out of exile and through the wilderness, back to their land, Isaiah 40:3-11, 41:17-19.

Help from God will come through divine justice, which sets people free and, at times, satisfies deep human desires, as stated in **Isaiah 40:41.** However, that's only part of the story. Help also comes through divine empowerment, enabling people to become what God created them to be, and to have their affections transformed so that their deepest desires reflect God's light and justice throughout the world.

God is not saying, "I might help you," or "I might show up if I have time." No, no, no, He says. "I will." That's a promise from the Creator to you. Now I know you might be thinking, Pastor, I have been praying for a miracle for a long time, nothing changed. But listen, just because you don't see the miracle right before you, doesn't mean God is not working on it. God works in ways you can't always see in ways you can't comprehend. Sometimes, God moves behind the scenes, setting things up, shifting your circumstances, and preparing the way for when your breakthrough comes. In other words, God is preparing you for the things to come and for His purpose, for your good.

What if your delay is not a denial, but God is preparing you for the blessing to come? Remember, God's timing is not our timing. We want things to happen when we think we need them. But when you receive your miracle, you will look back and realize it happened at the exact moment you needed it.

As we wait for our miracle, we must continue to trust and rely on the Lord, as Habakkuk did. Praying, praising, and showing our appreciation for what He has done and believing in His promises.

NAARVA held its 32nd National Camp Rally on July 13th-20th, 2025, in Allegan County Fairgrounds, Allegan, Michigan. At the rally, a storm blew through at approximately 4 to 4:30 a.m., if my memory serves me correctly. Mr. and Mrs. William Moore of the Broward County Kampers Klub were inside their coach, parked under a large tree, sound asleep. My coach was parked four sites east of theirs. Early that morning, I was awakened by an unknown loud boom that sounded as though a tree limb or branch had fallen, but I thought nothing of it because it appeared to me all was well.

When I finally got out of bed and went outside, I noticed the Moores were surveying the damage to their coach. A large branch had broken off a tree and landed directly on top of their coach, causing damage to the roof. I spoke with Mrs. Moore on August 22, 2025. She praised and credited God for protecting and saving their lives while they slept. She informed me that they did not sustain any injuries, but their coach was beyond repair. I say to her, "Praise God." She replied, "God has always protected them in the past." When we think God is not responding to our prayers, remember, He is always there listening and preparing the way for our victory.

You must keep in mind that you did not arrive at this moment in your life by accident. God brought you

to your destination because He sees you. Look at Isaiah 4:10 again, "Do not fear, for I am with you." You are not alone in your situation; God is with you. God sees you, in the middle of your pain, in the middle of your frustration, in the middle of your doubt. God sees you in your home when the bills are overwhelming. God sees you in the doctor's office when the news is not favorable. God sees you when you are at work and your supervisor is picking at you. God sees you when you are experiencing heartbreak. God sees you when your kids are acting up, and God sees you when you are unaware that you need His help. God says, I will strengthen you and help you, especially when you feel like you don't have an ounce of strength left to fight. God sees you, and He will carry you when you feel like giving up. He will hold you up with His righteous right hand even when you don't have the strength to stand. God sees you, and He knows your circumstances.

Never think God is not listening to your prayers. Keep calling on the name of the Lord, be faithful and obedient to His Word as you wait on His answer, and He will carry you through, because He sees you and hears your prayers.

Praise God! Praise God! Praise God!

Rocky Mountain RVRollers Celebrate 20 Years!



On May 14, 2005, a group of ten Colorado RV enthusiasts met at the home of Russell and Joan Cole with the intent of forming a Colorado Chartered Chapter of NAARVA. Under the organizational guidance of Evelyn Whitlock and Joan Cole and the enthusiasm and overwhelming support of everyone in attendance, the *Rocky Mountain RV Rollers* was created

The name was suggested by Jennifer Jackson and Willie James. The first executive officers were appointed: Joellen Davis, President; Evelyn Whitlock, VicePresident; Charles Houston, Recording Secretary; Robert Whitlock, Treasurer; and Barbara James, Financial Secretary. At a second meeting held at the home of Robert and Evelyn Whitlock, other appointments were made: Reggie York, Devotional Leader; Russell Cole, Wagon Master; and Willie James, Sergeant-at-Arms. At this meeting, the club decided upon a Constitution and By-Laws, club colors, which are: purple, black, white, and gold, and a club logo designed by Charlie Davis. Various committees were formed. It was decided that the first club campout would be held at the KOA campground in Fountain, Colorado, and that the club would host other NAARVA members from other areas in Colorado interested in becoming club members.

On August 3, 2005, Charter #46 was issued by NAARVA to the *Rocky Mountain RV Rollers*. From these humble beginnings, we now have 27 active memberships representing over 49 people living in Aurora, Castle Pines, Centennial, Colorado Springs, Denver, Fountain, Larkspur, Loveland, Strasburg, and Westminster, Colorado, and Lucas and Rio Grande City, Texas

The Rollers are a VERY active RV Club and we get together once a month for an "outing," which may be a campout for a weekend, a dinner, a brunch, bowling, game night, jazz festival, annual fundraiser or a membership meeting. We have traveled as a club around the state of Colorado exploring the "Casinos of Central City" to the "Sand Dunes" of Southern Colorado, as well as attending a "Blues Festival" in Trinidad, Colorado, attending a "Wine Tasting" in Winter Park, and touring the "Budweiser Brewery" in Ft. "Loving Our Earth - Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, Respect" NAARVA Committed to the Resolve of Plastic Pollution

Fellow Travelers.

It may be that I've exhausted your attentions regarding the hazards of plastic pollution. But this is so critical a topic that not enough can be reported or expressed. It is vital that our attentions remain firmly locked onto this progression of contamination across our globe, and indeed within our communities

We are introduced to the burdens of plastic pollutants regarding the injury to, and the detriment of wild life. We are advised of the contamination of our oceans and other water ways, the poisoning of our air during both plastic production and disposal, and the potentially threatening, lately discovered, human bodily accumulations, including the unborn, that challenge our biologically natural existence,

Each day that God sends, the equivalent of at least, two thousand (2,000) garbage trucks, full of plastics, are dumped into the world's ocean, rivers and lakes. Each truck carrying a capacity of 9-10 tons of compacted

garbage. This likely conservative estimate is quoted by the United Nations Environment Program. Other estimates exceed this quantity.

It is crucial to repeat that over 50% of plastics are used only once, then thrown "away". But what is, and where is "away"? Realistically, there is no "away". The plastics remain in our environment in various forms, are contained in various objects (including us), and are part and parcel of longlasting, injurious planetary impairment.

One plastic bottle takes an average of 450 years to break down. And this "break down" only produces micro- or nano- sized plastics, many of which are undetectable to the human eye, that inevitably enter into living organisms, both domestic and wild life, both plant and human life, and as well, our lifesupport systems, air and water.

Plastics are a constant in everyday life. They are irreplaceable as materials for medical devices and for food conservation, and because of their light weight, serve well for commercial


transport of various goods.

On the other hand, in addition to our excessive use of plastics, a greater problem stems from the unsustainable disposal of used plastic objects. This ultimately tragic disposal of plastic generates pollution of our landscapes, waterways, and general habitat, posing a threat to all life forms, and to related biodiversity.

It is unsettling to know that microplastics are now found in placental tissues, in major organ tissues, in blood, and in our food. Microplastics, generate harmful eco-toxicological effects on the health of animals and people. They are are present in all ecosystems, atmospheres, soils, seas and oceans, and in many organisms including fish, birds, domestic animals and humans.

Most plastics can be given new life, if disposed of methodically, correctly sorted after disposal, and sent for recycling. When that doesn't happen,



Environmental studies to remedy plastic pollution point to development

of what is described as acircular system wherein plastic products are designed to be reused, recycled, and repurposed. Legislative statutes to ensure these designs are required for community, national and global redress of plastic pollution.

On a more personal level, we can help reduce the size of the problem of *(Continued on page 11)*

plastic pollution problem by limiting our use of plastic products in our everyday living, using paper or reusable utensils for eating, bagging, and packaging. And remaining environmentally-conscious regarding product purchasing and disposal choices.

We can lobby for enforcement of effective circular economical systems; designing and ensuring the availability, and the use of plastic products that are reused, recycled, and composted.


NAARVA travelers, let us be encouraged to expand our commitment to both ecologically responsible travel, and life in general. We currently engage in planting a tree at each national rally. This wonderfully responsive, and well received "green" act, contributes to circular ecology as trees improve air quality by filtering pollutants, act as carbon sinks while providing oxygen, support wildlife habitat, prevent soil erosion, and other environmentally supportive achievements. All this in addition to their natural beauty, and soothing comforts. (See pic below from our July 2025 Allegan, Michigan national rally.) NAARVA has also committed to the planting of trees at a global level through donations to recognized international reforestation projects.

We are encouraged to broaden our ecological mindfulness through support of various types of reforestations, and by reducing our carbon footprint. In short, let us attend to our NAARVA Ecology Program mantra: "Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, Respect". Let us demonstrate our support of planetary health through re-

jection of singleuse plastics (employing alternative utensils), and through lobbying for regulated production and dis-

posal of plastic materials. Such actions offer hope for our future generations to enjoy, as we now do, natural, clean and healthy RV travel adventures.
