NARVA Chaplain's Corner... The Law?

Galatians 3:2-3, NIV: "I would like to learn just one thing from you: Did you receive the Spirit by the works of the law, or by believing what you heard? Are you so foolish? After beginning by means of the Spirit, are you now trying to finish by means of the flesh?"

Paul is talking to the Galatians to remind them to keep the faith and not to allow false doctrines to overcome their teaching. The Judaizers were spreading false doctrines, telling the Galatians they must keep the law.

To help us understand the questions, Paul is asking, in verses 2 and 3, we must understand the law and the purpose of the law. The law was never designed to give men justification, glorification, or salvation. No way, men, women, or children could live up to the law. The law was designed for our flesh because our flesh is in a sinful state our flesh is in constant opposition with the Spirit. Paul tells us that we all fall short of the glory of God. Romans 3:23.


The law lets us know when our actions and/or thoughts are not within God's Word. We have a fleshly flaw, a fleshly need, to sin, within us; we inherited this sinful nature from Adam.

The law helps us to recognize when

we are sinning. The law is a check and balance system designed by God for His children to give us knowledge when our actions or thoughts go against His Word. The law can't save us; it cannot give us eternal life that was not God's intention for the law.

The Galatian believers had accepted the gospel through Paul's preaching, Galatians 1:6-9. However, the Galatians are starting to listen to the Judaizers, men claiming they must follow the works of the Law.These false teachers suggest that faith is not enough to obtain salvation, Galatians 2:4. Paul says in verse 1, "falling for this lie is foolish." It is false teaching. Paul tells them to remember what they were taught when they first accepted Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior.

Paul begins to ask the Galatians a series of questions to help them reevaluate what they know to be true. In verse 1, Paul asked the Galatians who have bewitched you and cast an evil spell on you, that you have forgotten the truth. We are today, bewitched. We fall for the same old trick the devil uses repeatedly. The devil sends a smooth-talking person our way and twist God's Word to fit into

our needs, the needs that go against God's Word. We look for someone to preach to us our worldly desires. Be very careful who you listen to. I tell you, to always watch what they do, not what they say. The devil is cunning, and he knows our desires.

Paul asked the Galatians whether they received the Spirit by works of the law or by hearing of faith. He asked them to remember how they received the Holy Spirit. He said, "Did following the Mosaic Law save you, or was it the Holy Spirit?"

Paul points out that the law is not of faith. The law was about works that demonstrate the need for faith. Paul explains that the Scriptures declare that we are all prisoners of sin, so we receive God's promise of freedom only by believing in Jesus Christ. Before, people thought they were in the custody of the law, as a child is under a guardian. Law helps clarify the depth and severity of our falling short of God's glory.

The Law of Moses, in particular, serves as a tutor to show us the need for salvation by faith in Jesus. The law is not of faith, but the law helps us to see the need for faith. No one can be righteous in God's sight by the works of the law. We must rely on His righteousness, which He freely gives to all who believe in Jesus Christ. These questions Paul asked the Galatians were designed to help them remember that they were saved by the power of the Holy Spirit. My question to you, can you recall the day when you gave your life to Christ? Was it by faith or by the law?

Paise God, Praise God, Praise God. Amen







Amend Plastic: Use for Our Health, Safety and Survival

Genesis 1:26-28: "And God said, let us make man in our image, ...and let them have dominion over the fish in the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, ...Male and female created he them. And God blessed them and said to them, 'Be fruitful and multiply; and replenish the earth and subdue it'." *(not destroy it)*. We are given rule over the fish in the sea, birds in the sky, and every living creature that moves on the ground. We are given responsibility as stewards of the earth, and must choose to be responsible.

Pennsylvania may become the 13th state to institute a ban on all single use plastic bags at retailers and businesses. Currently, 12 U.S. states have such a ban in place. They include California, Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, Hawaii, Maine, New Jersey, New York, Oregon, Rhode Island, Vermont, and Washington, with California being the first in 2016. Several recent studies show that these bans have already prevented billions of bags from being used...most used only once... and then fated to pollute our lands, waterways, and oceans.

We applaud some 500 cities across the U.S. that have instituted a defined ban on plastic bags as well. Some bans allow plastic bag dispensation for cold, frozen, or produce items. However, there may be a fee attached to retailissued recyclable paper bags. The ultimate goal is to fundamentally limit the use of plastics, and to encourage consumers to develop their own practice of bringing reusable bags with them when shopping...particularly at grocery retailers.

Aldi is the first major U.S. retailer to commit to removing plastic checkout bags, thus saving an estimate 4400 tons of plastic each year. Here, customers are encouraged to bring their own reusable bags, or they may purchase paper bags or reusable totes as needed.

Plastic pollution is one of the most lasting sources of human waste, taking at least 20 to hundreds of years to decompose. The production, use, and discard of plastics must be controlled as they are proven threats to environmental sustainability and to life itself, posing a hazard to atmospheric, terrestrial, and marine environments. Also, submitting resident species to the risk of poisoning or suffocation from, or entanglement in, discarded plastic pollutants. Research indicates that more than 1,500 species in marine and terrestrial environments are known to ingest plastics. We have long discovered that countless avian, terrestrial, and marine life have at most perished from, or perhaps worst, agonizingly survived ingestion of discarded

plastics, which are usually mistaken by them to be food. We can only estimate the long-term damage of these occurrences that adversely impact the habitat, quantities, survival, and reproduction of a species.

Additionally, it is estimated that plastic products were responsible for 5% of global greenhouse gas emissions, with 90% of these emissions coming from production and conversion of fossil fuels into new plastic products. The OECD also reports that unless human behavior changes, greenhouse gas emissions associated with the life cycle of plastic products are expected to double by 2060.

Plastic pollution has become ubiquitous in natural and built environments, raising concerns about potential harm to humans and nature alike. Many plastics don't actually decom-

pose, but instead break down into small pieces called microplastics (less than 5 mm or the width of a pencil eraser) or nanoplastics (a human hair is approximately 80,000-100,000 nanometers wide), and have been found in human livers, kidneys, brains and placentas. Once in the environment, plastic pollutants can fragment into these smaller pieces of plastic. These tiny pieces are now found in every ecosystem on the planet from the Antarctic tundra to tropical coral reefs. The average liter of bottled water can decompose producing nearly a quarter million of pieces of tiny nanoplastics. These pieces, invisible to the naked eye, can enter into our body cells, and are associated with multiple diseases and disorders.


As the exact mechanisms of internalized micro- and nanoplastics are not yet scientifically agreed upon, we must remain cautious...simply because plastics are pervasive and enduring, taking between 100 to 1,000 years or more to decompose depending on environmental conditions. They present as invasive elements, small enough to induce biological hazard, result in or pro-motecellular damage, and ultimately trigger either or bothchemical and physical harm to humans and other life forms, both plant and animal.

Also, it is important to recognize that chemical additives found in plastics may leach into our foods. Plastics may contain multiple additives, some known as plasticizers, that have been identified as carcinogens or cancercausing chemicals. These additives are currently the most disturbing issue regarding plastic use and decomposition, as they are known carcinogens, and can leach into, and become internalized, in body cells. Carcinogenic additives may include plasticizers such asphthalates and bisphenols

How Plastic Chemicals Get Into Food

ENVIRONMENT



AGRICULTURE



Plastic trash

in landfills can degrade, allowing chemicals to leach into water and soil.

Incineration and production

of plastic can release chemicals into the air.

Microplastics

may be generated during production, use, or disposal, eventually entering your food.

Animals

such as cows may consume water and plants contaminated with plasticizers.

Plastic mulch

is sometimes used to suppress the growth of weeds, then plowed right into the fields.

Plants

can drink up plasticizers from the soil, right along with the nutrients they need to grow.

PROCESSING



requires high temperatures that may speed up leaching.

Vinyl gloves

can contain more than one-third plasticizers by weight.

Flexible plastic tubing

may be used in the processing of milk and oils.

Conveyor belts,

which move food as it's processed, may be plasticized.

PACKAGING



Bisphenols

can show up in food packaging, including lined metal cans.

Plasticizers

may be found in plastic wraps and jar gaskets.



(BPAs), and are associated with cell stress, DNA damage, and change in cell function. Additionally, it is determined that these additives can leach into tap water... causing developmental, reproductive, neurological, and immune disorders. Leaching also results from food packaging, and from vinyl gloves used in food preparation.

To limit or avoid exposure to leached additives or plasticizers:

- 1. Don't microwave in plastics. Heat makes plastics release harmful chemicals.
- 2. Use glass or steel water bottles.
- 3. Store food items in glass containers as much as possible.
- 4. Choose wood, stainless steel or silicone for kitchen

tools and cutlery; reject plastic ones.

- 5. Eat more fresh, minimally processed foods to reduce intake of phthalates, BPAs, or other chemical additives.
- 6. Limit higher fatty foods (fried foods, red meat) that can contain higher levels of plasticizers.
- 7. Support governmental oversight of plastic production, composition, and disposition.

Keep in mind that our government doesn't require that chemicals used in plastics and other materials be comprehensively tested for safety. Exposure to these substances has been shown to increase the risk of everything from infertility to poorer fetal and child development, and cancer. From this we can see that government oversight is required to ensure minimal exposure to plastics and associated chemicals in our environment; the consumer cannot be assigned the burden of trying to figure out if products are toxic.

Write to your political representatives to express your concerns in support of legislative regulations on plastic production, use, disposal, and recycling.


